

1- Academic Development

The Academic Development Committee is responsible for identifying and planning educational enrichment opportunities for members. Events may include study sessions, tutoring programs, basic software training, and other events as deemed fit by the committee.

2- TENE

The TENE Committee is responsible for planning and coordinating member attendance to the annual TENE event: TAMU-SPE's largest technical event of the year. The purpose of this conference is to bring together professionals and students from across the industry.

3- Diversity and Inclusion

The Diversity and Inclusion (D&I) Committee is responsible for raising awareness for and coordinating events that emphasize the importance of D&I advocacy in the energy sector. Major areas of focus should include informative expositions, panel discussions, and team-building activities.

4- Freshmen Outreach

The Freshman Outreach Committee is composed of highly involved and high-achieving first-year students who create programs and events that boost freshman involvement and cultivate future leaders of TAMU-SPE.

5- Future Energy

The Future Energy committee is in charge of organizing events, special courses, and panels that are related to emerging energy forms and technologies. Such areas include CCUS, Geothermal Energy, Hydrogen, Digitization of the O&G industry, Renewables, etc.

6- Golf Tournament

The DVG Golf Tournament Committee is responsible for planning and executing the annual golf tournament held each spring. Funds are allocated for student scholarships managed by the department of petroleum engineering

7- Hospitality

The Hospitality Committee is responsible for spearheading the acquisition and delivery of tens of thousands of dollars worth of consumable assets. Logistically, this includes ordering meals and organizing clean-up for TAMU-SPE General Meetings, Lunch & Learns, and other special events. The dedicated hospitality committee will support the director in accomplishing these goals.

8- Industry Experiences

The Industry Experiences committee is responsible for planning interactive tours, professional development workshops, and networking experiences with industry professionals. Events may include tours of rigs, frac sites, production facilities, and manufacturing facilities as well as the Executive Series.

9- Merchandise

The Merchandise Committee is responsible for creating and selling TAMU-SPE apparel and other branded items to the student body and alumni.

10-Mentorship

The SPE Student Mentorship program is responsible for coordinating one-on-one mentorships between mentors (comprised of both qualified upperclassmen and industry professionals) and mentees (comprised of motivated underclassmen who intend to distinguish themselves and more effectively prepare for the fall recruiting season and potential leadership within the TAMU SPE organization). Directors and co-chairs are to be coordinated internally at the end of the fall semester and members in the spring semester by the Student Mentorship Program Committee. The Student Mentorship Program will take place during the spring, summer, and subsequent fall semester.

11- Energy4Me

Energy4me is a TAMU-SPE outreach initiative that seeks to educate the BCS community about and raise positive awareness for the oil and gas industry. Energy is a critical issue worldwide, and TAMU-SPE believes face-to-face contact is the ideal way to spread the word about energy conservation and the future of the oil and gas industry and its impact on the planet. This committee organizes events tailored towards students in grades K-12 within CSISD and BISD. Typical events include presentations (involving interactive demonstrations) at elementary-, middle-, and high-schools and STEM nights/festivals. Additionally, the committee is responsible for hosting an annual energy discussion series and providing Energy Facts of the Week.

12- Petrobowl

The Petrobowl Committee is responsible for selecting and organizing a team to represent Texas A&M at the International Petrobowl Competition during the SPE Annual Technical Conference and Exhibition (ATCE). Preparation includes study sessions, regional qualifiers, and TAMU-SPE Petrobowl Competitions.

13- Service

The Service Committee is responsible for planning community service events throughout the year and organizing donation campaigns for local charities. The committee shall encourage member participation in various activities such as the Big Event, Glow 5k, Habitat for Humanity, Relay for Life, Special Olympics, and Scotty's House.

14- Recruitment

The Recruitment Committee is responsible for actively recruiting and encouraging member participation in the student chapter. Activities include raising interest about petroleum engineering among general engineering freshmen, hosting departmental tours for visiting and prospective students, organizing SPE's participation in Aggieland Saturday and Entry-To-A-Major Saturday.

15- Fishing Tournament

The Fishing Tournament Committee is responsible for planning and executing the annual spring fishing tournament. Funds are allocated to the chapter general fund.

16- Sporting clays

The Sporting Clays Tournament Committee is responsible for planning and executing the annual fall sporting clay tournament. Funds are allocated to partially cover the chapter's attendance to the SPE Annual Technical Conference and Exhibition (ATCE).

17- Intramural Sports

The Intramural Sport Committee is responsible for coordinating sports networking events that enhance relations between students and sometimes industry professionals. Activities include the annual Paintball Tournament, SPE intramural sports, football and volleyball matches, and other activities as determined by the committee.

18- Technical Development

The Technical Development Committee is responsible for planning events that enhance the technical proficiency of the student body, including seminars, R&D series, software training, panel discussions and certifications, and other activities as determined by the committee.

19 Tailgating

The Tailgating Committee is responsible for organizing TAMU-SPE tailgates for home football games.

20- International Experiences

The International Experiences committee plans cultural, lingual and educational events to connect students from different nationalities and dissolve cultural barriers. Events may include potlucks, holiday parties, and language lessons. Additionally, The International Experiences Committee is responsible for compiling the annual international students resume book and facilitating a specially-designed industry mentoring program for international students.

21- Social Events

This committee organizes social events and activities such as the Welcome Back BBQ, the Crawfish Boil, and the SPE Graduation party.

22- Website

The Website committee is mainly responsible for managing the TAMU_SPE website and updating it with weekly events and announcements.

23- CEE & Career Development

The Career Enhancement Event (CEE) and Career Development Committee is responsible for planning, advertising, and executing the Fall and Spring CEEs and associated career fair preparatory events (resume workshops, mock interviews). As the largest discipline-specific career fairs at Texas A&M University, the CEEs are tailored to the oil and gas industry and attract hundreds of recruiters and students each semester.

-The Career Development is in charge of planning leadership workshops, mock interviews, online presence, and resume workshops.

24- Media

The Media Committee is responsible for branding and promoting the chapter and its events, both internally and externally. Internally, this is done through the chapter website and social media accounts and through photographic documentation of events. Externally, this is done through communication with petroleum industry-related departments at Texas A&M University, the SPE Gulf Coast Section, and SPE International.

25- Sophomore Retreat

The SPE Sophomore Retreat committee is responsible for planning the annual sophomore retreat program. This event is intended to introduce students to the PETE Department and to prepare them for the SEC Career Fair and Career Enhancement Event (CEE). Retreat activities include a resume workshop, mock career fair, and presentations from company representatives.
